FEW's Mission Statement

CIVIL RIGHTS IN THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

Following are some the major accomplishments that have made a difference in employment of the federal government:

Executive Order (E.O.) 11246 (September 24, 1965) barred discrimination in federal employment based on race, color, religion, or national origin. It also provided for nondiscrimination in employment by government contractors and subcontractors. It called for programs of equal opportunity at the agency level under the supervision of the U.S. Civil Service Commission (CSC) now the office of Personnel Management (OPM). It required establishment of complaint procedures within each agency to provide an

avenue for appeal to the SCS who was also required to issue regulations implementing these provisions.

E.O. 11375 (1967) amended E.O. 11245 to prohibit sex discrimination in federal employment.

The Equal Pay Act of 1963, amended in 1974 to cover federal employees, prohibits payment of different wages to one group of people doing essentially the same work as another group.

The Age Discrimination in Employment Act (ADEA) of 1967 prohibits discrimination in employment because of age and applies to individuals at least 40 years of age in the private sector. In 1974 the ADEA was amended to include federal employees and allowed individuals to take complaints of age discrimination directly to court. In 1978 the Act was again amended by the Civil Service Reform Act to remove mandatory retirement at age 70.

The Civil Rights Act of 1991 affords victims of intentional discrimination jury trials and compensatory damages (non-federal employees may also be liable for punitive damages), and makes it illegal to adjust test scores based on race, color, sex, or national origin.

Note: FEW has partnered with a law firm that will give free consultations to its members on EEO issues.

Indian Heritage Month is an opportunity to honor the many contributions of American Indians and Alaska Natives and to recognize the strong and living traditions of the first people to call our land home.

American Indians and Alaska Natives continue to shape our Nation by preserving the heritage of their ancestors and by contributing to the rich diversity that is our country's strength. Their dedicated efforts to honor their proud heritage have helped others gain a deeper understanding of the vibrant and ancient customs of the Native American community. We also express our gratitude to the American Indians and Alaska Natives who serve in our Nation's military and work to extend the blessings of liberty around the world.

My Administration is committed to supporting the American Indian and Alaska Native cultures. In June, I signed the "Native American Home Ownership Opportunity Act of 2007," which reauthorizes the Indian Housing Loan Guarantee Program, guaranteeing loans for home improvements and expanding home ownership for Native American families. Working with tribal governments, we will strive for greater security, healthier lifestyles, better schools, and new economic opportunities for American Indians and Alaska Natives.

During National American Indian Heritage Month, we underscore our commitment to working with tribes on a government to government basis and to supporting tribal sovereignty and self-determination. During this month, I also encourage Federal agencies to continue their work with tribal governments to ensure sound cooperation. Efforts such as on-line training programs will improve interagency collaboration in the Federal Indian Affairs community and help to strengthen relationships with tribes, building a brighter future for all our citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GEORGE W. BUSH, President of the United States of America, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the United States, do hereby proclaim November 2007 as National American Indian Heritage Month. I call upon all Americans to commemorate this month with appropriate programs and activities.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand this thirty-first day of October, in the year of our Lord two thousand seven, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and thirty-second.

On October 18, the House Foreign Affairs Committee held a hearing, "International Trafficking in Persons: Taking Action to Eliminate Modern Day Slavery."

Education- On October 17, the House Science and Technology Research and Science Education Subcommittee held a hearing on the federal government's role in increasing the numbers of women in academic science and engineering fields.

Child Protection- On October 17, the House Judiciary Committee held a hearing to examine legislative proposals on Internet sex crimes, including child pornography and Internet sexual predators

Common Colds vs. the Flu

Colds and flu are both highly contagious and, in the initial stages, a bad cold and a mild case of the flu might seem alike. However flu is a serious illness that can have life-threatening complications, unlike colds. Check this table for a comparison of the symptoms for each illness. If you are having symptoms of the flu be sure to get an appointment scheduled with your doctor within 24 hours.

Symptoms	Cold	Flu
Fever	Rare	Characteristic, high (102-104F) last 3-4 days
Headache	Rare	Prominent
General aches, pain	Slight	Usual, often severe
Fatigue/weakness	Quite mild	Can last up to 2-3 weeks
Extreme Exhaustion	Never	Early and prominent

Stuffy Nose	Common	Sometimes
Sneezing	Usual	Sometimes
Sore Throat	Usual	Sometimes
Chest discomfort and cough	Mild to moderate; Hacking cough	Common; can become severe

Be proud, FEW Sisters, the current STS-120 mission is being commanded by NASA astronaut, Pamela Ann Melroy (Colonel, USAF, RET.)

A series of recent shuttle missions have added to the International Space Station's exterior with new elements for its main

truss. Now, Discovery will take into orbit a connecting module that will increase the orbiting laboratory's interior space.

October's STS-120 mission will bring the Harmony module, christened after a school contest, that will provide attachment points for European and Japanese laboratory modules. Known in technical circles as Node 2, it is similar to the six-sided Unity module that links the U.S. and Russian sections of the station
